Congregations that approach financial stewardship from a biblical perspective do not view the money Christians give to their church merely as a way to pay its bills. Rather, such congregations see financial contributions as a way to help people grow spiritually in their relationship with God by supporting their church's mission and ministry with a percentage of their incomes.

Our congregation's Stewardship Committee has selected the *New Consecration Sunday Stewardship Program* as a way to teach the biblical and spiritual principles of generous giving in our stewardship education emphasis this year.

New Consecration Sunday is based on the biblical philosophy of the need of the giver to give for his or her own spiritual development, rather than on the need of the church to receive. Instead of treating people like members of a social club who should pay dues, we will treat people like followers of Jesus Christ who want to give unselfishly as an act of discipleship. New Consecration Sunday encourages people toward proportionate and systematic giving in response to the question, "What percentage of my income is God calling me to give?"

During morning worship on Consecration Sunday, we are asking our attendees and members to make their financial commitments to our church's missionary, benevolent, and educational ministries in this community and around the world.

Every attendee and member who completes an *Estimate of Giving Card* does so voluntarily by attending morning worship on Consecration Sunday. We urge people to attend who feel strongly opposed to completing a card. The procedure is done in such a way that no one feels personal embarrassment if he or she chooses not to fill out a card.

We will do no home solicitation to ask people to complete cards. During morning worship our guest leader will conduct a brief period of instruction and inspiration, climaxed by members making their commitments as a confidential act of worship.

We will encourage participation in Consecration Sunday events through the Consecration Sunday team and Council Members. Since we will make no follow-up visits to ask people to complete their cards, we will make every effort to inform, inspire, and commit everyone to attend Consecration Sunday worship.

#### **NEWBORNS IN NEED**



#### —Giving Thanks—

Even though the weather had been unexpectedly warm, the marks of autumn were very apparent on the tips of trees. it is very natural to me to be reminded of the song of Ecclesiastes: there is a time for certain things, time to plant and time to harvest.

Since I have passed a certain number of birthdays, autumn appears a little more special.

We often find wisdom in nature that we normally miss in the breathless schedule of busy life.

My mother passed away two years ago in Korea. I missed her last years of her life since I have lived in the States for a while. Telephone is the only way that I could get comforted when I missed her presence. During the conversation of those years she said again and again that how grateful she had been and wanted me to understand how blessed I have been. Then she always concluded our conversation with her theology: It is only when we reach the far shores of major challenge (crisis) that we can look back and see some of the distance we have traveled, and become aware of why the particular part of our journey was necessary: the people that we encountered, the places that we have been. I have convinced that this is knowledge, which is impossible to have in advance. Only when we open our hearts and trust God and move forward one step at a time, then later, only later we take the joy of new discovery and encounters with angels around us in gratitude. "That is the grace of God," she says and adds "count your blessings that you already have received and be thankful, instead of focusing on what you don't have."

We hear the same word in Paul's letter to the Corinthians. "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness."

I often feel that if I have just a little more quiet space, or a little more skill in communication, or a little more support, I would be able to do what I need to do for "every good work." However, God actually has given me all that I need to do the work God has given me to do, even if it is not all that I want. I count my blessings that I have now instead of thinking about how much more I need. If I do that, I will be much more in tune with God and become more free.

Perhaps many of us feel as if we never have enough blessings to be grateful. Yet God is generous, compassionate, and steadfast in love. Perhaps it is time to accept the gifts and give thanks for what we have instead of focusing on the 'not enough' pieces of our lives. God's gift is abundant in us and around us. Are we ready to receive it?

This season of thanksgiving, I pray that you may know the abundant grace of God in you and those around you, and savor those moments that you have now and treasure it.

Movie Info 13 year-old Bethany Hamilton is a champion surfer who was born to be in the water. But after a fun night out night surfing and what should be a fun day in the water, she is attacked by a shark and loses her arm. Rushed to the hospital, she remains calm, and maintains her faith in God. Now she has to re-learn how to do everything with only one arm - including how to surf. It will take her friends, family, and her Christian faith to get her back into the water, but if that is where she is meant to be, she will find a way to get there.

For parents to consider:

Soul Surfer is rated PG for an intense accident sequence and some thematic material. It's a wholesome, profanity-free film that would be completely appropriate for the whole family were it not for the necessary element of the shark attack. Although not treated gruesomely, the very fact of the attack, and the strong sense of peril, may be too intense for younger viewers.

Ultimately, the trip was made most enjoyable due to wonderful experiences and conversations I had with the group I went with (see photo). We totally enjoyed each other's company and made lasting friendships.

# Congratulations to Children Presented with Their Very Own Bibles

Teaching children about the bible is one of the most important steps to building a strong Christian foundation. On October 16 and 23 nine of our FUMC children participated in a Bible Retreat. Through games, videos, and other activities the children became very comfortable with locating passages, learning the history of the bible, and more important learning that the Bible is God's Word. They learned how God demonstrated love and mercy through the stories that have been written in

According to 2Timothy 1:5, Timothy became a good man because both his mother and grandmother taught him the scriptures from an young age. The principles he learned gave him the appropriate background to be chosen by the apostle Paul as his protégé. Children who read scripture at an early age will be more likely to retain that information into adulthood.

Be sure and share with these children how the bible has been an important part of your own faith formation.

# Children Gr. 2-5 Join Kids InC. (Kids in Christ)

Kids InC. is a program that teaches the children through hands on projects the basics of service. The concepts of sharing and caring are central themes throughout scripture. The bible is full of stories about caring for the poor and oppressed. From Acts 1:8 we read "You'll be my witnesses, telling people about me everywhere-in Jerusalem, throughout Judea, in Samaria, and to the ends of the earth". For children, that might sound something like this: "You'll be my witnesses, telling people about me everywhere-at home and school, throughout your town, across the country, and to the ends of the earth."
