

It has been a long winter! How difficult it would have been if we had not had special people who helped us through the cold and icy weather! I have realized how we humans need one another in the wintry days of our lives, when our tired bodies get cold and our hearts face the arctic wind. At these times, we need someone to warm our frozen bodies and hearts and to stand by us. They give us a sense of hope and strength to sustain us through the down times and bring us a vision of tomorrow: Spring!

There are moments in our lives when we are not strong. We feel vulnerable. If we have others who stand by us and walk with us the journey will be bearable. Even Jesus desired companionship. In the Gospels, Jesus had his own "moments". He often sought solitude and desired renewal when his body and spirit were weary and worn out by relying on the movement of the Spirit. In Bethany, at the home of Lazarus, Mary and Martha, their friendship must have provided him with great comfort. He yearned for his disciples to be awake and praying in the Garden of Olives during the final hours of his journey. Jesus showed us that we all need companionship. It is clear to me why he sent out his disciples in pairs.

People hide their pain and sorrow. They do not like to be dependent, even on something physical like using a cane. For some reason, we feel less strong if we become less independent.

The truth is, in both living and dying, we all need to rely on others. That's the blessing of human love and compassion. There are situations and moments in our lives when we are not strong. We become weak, miserable and helpless. If we learn to rely on others in such moments, perhaps we will be led to rely on God in life. Perhaps we will be able to get a glimpse of the power of the resurrection that brings life to the dead.

Easter is on the rise! Please come and celebrate the risen Lord in your community of faith.

"In the shadow of your wings I take refuge, until destroying storms pass by." (Psalm 57:1)

It's hard to believe that we are almost finished with our sixth year! We started with an idea, a grant from the United Methodist Foundation, six students, and six volunteers! And now, the Friendship Center, Sunday School Room, and hallway are transformed every Wednesday from 4 - 5pm into a mini school with 20 students and 20 volunteers. We are a free, community outreach program that involves Wood View Elementary School students, BHS National Honor Society Members, Friendship Church members, family and friends. One of our mentors is a former Study Club member from Wood View! Whether the student calls the volunteer their mentor, their teacher, or their partner, they know they have a special friend - someone who cares just about them. They struggle with reading and/or math skills, and their principal, Jody Ellis, recommends them to our program based on test scores. So, we gather once a week so that all students can achieve academic success!

# **Anniversary T-Shirts on Sale!**



Serving at the Daybreak Shelter -- Richard R. Guzman

In the richest country on earth, homelessness grows. Over 1.5 million of those are children, which drives the average age of a homeless person in the U.S. down to 9 years old. That's one reason the work Friendship Church does at the Daybreak Shelter in Joliet is so important: more people than ever need our help. It also helps us fulfill one of the Bible's most persistent calls: to serve the poor in Jesus' name.

Despite the unfortunate circumstances of the shelter's clients, it's fun to get to know them and to experience their thankfulness. As volunteers, we get to know each other better, too, as we cook and serve together. And bringing the whole family is one of the best ways to help ingrain a spirit of service into children--a spirit that can bring joy, purpose, and a passion for helping others into their futures. It's one of the greatest things a parent can give their kids.
