Reflections from Pastor Anna

God's purpose was to equip God's people for the work of serving and building up the body of Christ until we all reach the unity of faith and knowledge of God's standard of the fullness of Christ. ~ Ephesians 4:12-13

As I prepared for the final stage of building refurbishment (stop by any time to see the new carpet in my office), I cleaned my desk and book cases. As I browsed through them, I have to confess that at this stage of my life I have purchased more books than I can possibly read and remember what it says and apply it to my life. I've realized that I need to spend more time outside of my office to meet people where they are, to breathe fresh air, and to get Vitamin D from the sunlight.

Summer is a wonderful time for most of us to rejuvenate our bodies and minds. I hope you have had a chance to be in nature, visit different places, or enjoy a reunion with family members even in a limited period of time and space.

Summer is also a time for preparation for a new beginning. Most of our children who graduated from high school will leave us in a week or two. If you do, you won't find much there aside from a bunch of overgrown weeds and dried up plants. One must water, fertilize and pinch off dead leaves and stems. It is hard but rewarding work.

To plan a garden is to invest in the future of one's well-being and bountiful table. Such work requires love, attention, care and commitment. Growing disciples involves similar effort and process. One doesn't baptize the person and then only attend to cultivating the disciple a couple of times a year or even an hour on Sundays. It take the same kind of consistent effort and commitment to grow disciples and strengthen their faith as it does to take a plant from seedling to abundant harvest.

As we embark on a new school year, I invite all of you to take opportunities through Friendship Church to grow, love and serve. Get to know more of God's love by coming to worship. Learn God's will for all people by taking classes. Serve God and God's people by participating in several ministries that we need your support and engagement, get involved in mission works, or help serve in Sunday School for children and youth.

I trust God in whom we live, move, and exist will nourish our body and mind, and guide us


with renewing spirit as we grow in love of God for the people of God in this land.

Around the Church

Second Quarter Stewardship Update For 2015 we received pledge cards from 62 members for a total of \$221, 616. This total was significantly higher than 2014. As of June 30th, we have received contributions from those members of \$103, 760 or 47% of the annual total. To be on track we should be at 50% or \$110,808 so we are about \$7,000 behind through the second quarter.

Overall the giving of our members to support our ministries is very encouraging. Loose giving (checks from member who did not pledge) through June totaled \$10, 990 and total giving through June was \$114, 770. If we can match this giving for the remainder of the year, total income would be over \$229,000 which is \$3,000 more than our budgeted income of \$226,000. The Stewardship Committee appreciates your faithful support of our ministries.

Second Quarter Finance Update

The overall financial condition within Friendship Church closely mirrors the stewardship results. Our total revenue is running approximately %1500 behind budgeted receipts and closely follows last year's results. Total revenues this year are \$123,918 vs. the budgeted amount of \$124, 602. In addition to pledges running slightly behind, building usage fees are also lagging behind budgeted plans. On the positive side, our Easter contributions were \$700 higher than expected.

Expenses for the 1st half of the year have remained within our budgeted totals are being handled extremely well by all the involved committees and staff. Currently, we are \$2000 below budgeted expenses.

The finance committee is very encouraged by our consistent giving and encourages all members to continue this positive trend. You are the reason we are a positive force in our community! Thanks to all!






The Good and Beautiful God: Falling in Love with the God Jesus Knows Sundays, September 27-November 22, 8:30-9:30am
