Reflections from Pastor Anna

"I will sing praises to you, my strength, because God is my stronghold, my loving God." Psalm 59:17

I forgot the title, but several years ago, I read about a man who decided to write a thank you note every day for a whole year, 365 notes, and he did.

What struck me most was he started this practice when he hit the bottom in his life. He had lost everything; his law firm, marriage, money, friendships, family-just like Job in the Old Testament. In the same manner of writing his last will, he picked up a pen and started to write "thank you" to those who had been in his life, starting with his own child who was estranged for many years. While writing a thank you note every day, he started to notice a change in him and when he completed this mission, 365 days later, not only was he transformed, but the community around him was transformed. Sounds surreal? This is a real story.

I was so touched by his life that I started to write down three "gratitudes" each day. At first what came to me were general ones: family, shelter, food. But then the gratitude became more real: a good conversation with Alex, beautiful songs of such creative musicians as James Taylor, the smell of newly cut grass, the middle of the night text message saying "I'm ok, Mom".

And then I found myself being intentional as I lived the day and looked for the gratitude: falling leaves, a remote parking lot for an extra workout, traffic jam on Highway 355 for extra time praying for loved ones, government leaders, sanitary workers. And I often found myself surrounded by many blessings that I can't

count them all. And I've become filled with pure gratitude and so burst with tears of joy that my wonderful life can be part of the bigger blessings of the universe, this sacred Given-ness from Creator God. I have discovered that gratitude is the secret to happiness.

"Rejoice always. Pray continually. Give thanks in every situation for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus." I Thessalonians 5:16-18

Paul did not say give thanks for every situation but in the midst of every situation we may face.

Johnson Oatman, Jr., a local Methodist pastor and businessman wrote in 1897 "Count Your Blessings" which has helped millions to focus on their blessings from God:

When upon Life's billows you are tempest-tossed, When you are discouraged, thinking all is lost, Count your blessings, name them one by one, And it will surprise you what the Lord has done.

Gratitude is a spiritual practice. In this Thanksgiving season, let us practice gratitude. Count your blessings intentionally. As we do, God may transform our heart and help us discover abundant given-ness of God's generosity in our life and around us every day.



Consecration Sunday is Coming!

Congregations that approach financial stewardship from a biblical perspective do not view the money Christians give to their church merely as a way to pay its bills. Rather, such congregations see financial contributions as a way to help people grow spiritually in their relationship with God by supporting their church's mission and ministry with a percentage of their incomes.



Our congregation's Stewardship committee has selected the New Consecration Sunday Stewardship Program as a way to teach the biblical and spiritual principles of generous giving in our stewardship education emphasis this year.

New Consecration Sunday is based on the biblical philosophy of the need of the giver to give for his or her own spiritual development, rather than on the need of the church to receive. Instead of treating people like members of a social club who should pay dues, we will treat people like followers of Jesus Christ who want to give unselfishly as an act of discipleship. New Consecration Sunday encourages people toward proportionate and systematic giving in response to the question, "What percentage of my income is God calling me to give?"

During morning worship on Consecration Sunday, November 22, 2015, we are asking our attendees and members to make their financial commitments to our church's missionary, benevolent, and educational ministries in this community and around the world.

Every attendee and member who completes an *Estimate of Giving Card* does so voluntarily by attending morning worship on Consecration Sunday. We urge people to attend who feel strongly opposed to completing a card. The procedure is done in such a way that no one feels personal embarrassment if he or she chooses not to fill out a card.

We will do no home solicitation to ask people to complete cards. During morning worship our guest leader will conduct a brief period of instruction and inspiration, climaxed by members making their commitments as a confidential act of worship.

We will encourage participation in Consecration Sunday events through the Consecration Sunday team and Church Council members. Since we will make no follow-up visits to ask people to complete their cards, we will make every effort to inform, inspire, and commit everyone to attend Consecration Sunday worship.




Third Quarter Stewardship Update

For 2015 we received pledge cards from 62 members for a total of \$221,616. This total was significantly higher than 2014. As of September 30th, we have received contributions from those members of \$154,409 or 69.7% of the annual total. To be on track, we should be at 75% or \$166,212 so we are about \$8,000 behind through the third quarter. Historically, the summer is a time when we fall behind in our giving and we normally see an increase in the fourth quarter.

Overall, the giving of our members to support our ministries is very encouraging. Loose giving (checks from members who did not pledge) through June totaled \$16,132 and total giving through June was \$170,541. If we can match this giving for the remainder of the year, total income would be over \$227,000 which is \$1,000 more than our budgeted income of \$226,000.

The Stewardship Committee appreciates your faithful support of our ministries. For those of you that have fallen behind in your pledge, we strongly encourage you to do everything possible to catch up by the end of the year. If you did not turn in a pledge card, please prayerfully consider what you can do to support the work of our ministries. Those of you that are on target (75%), we appreciate your continued support.
