Reflections from Pastor Anna Shin

Yes, But, How?

I guess this is the question that I have recently raised most often. Yes, But How?

--Yes, I understand the mission of the church is to make disciples for the transformation of the world. But how do we do this? What does making disciples look like? What is a disciple anyway?

With that question in our hearts, on Thursday nights last several months, from March through July, I have been blessed to sit around the Sunday school room table with 8 of you (Deji, Mike, Dave, Robin, Vicki, Carolyn W, Carolyn J, Leonard) who have agreed to serve on a task force that will explore how our congregation might structure, prepare ourselves for creating disciple making process as a congregation.

We started with several questions: what does mature disciple of Jesus look like? What are we doing? Where do we want to go? How will we get there?

Mature disciples of Jesus Christ are like the one who has the knowledge of Bible, displays humble spirit, spends time in devotion to the word and prayer, gives one's financial resources and time and talents generously for the bigger than oneself; takes care of others who are in need...

At one point we asked to imagine, 'before' picture and 'after' picture. For example, picture of yourself now or before you join Friendship Church and picture of yourself after several years of being active at Friendship. Will there be any difference in your behavior, thoughts, words, values? How would you look like, act like in daily life? Do you expect to be transformed to having 6 pack core of Christian faith?

Imagining we all want to claim 'six-pack-core', our next question was 'how do we start?" Do we, as a church, offer a kind of roadmap for people to imagine themselves to grow strong and mature in knowledge and love of God? If we do, do people know about it? How do we hold accountable for one another toward our spiritual health and growth?

We've admitted that we have not offered any roadmap or guidance to our people to be mature disciples of Christ at this moment and we've concluded that we should create a clear, focused, intentional, aligned with our vision as the Body of Christ in 21st century, and simple process to get there together and communicate them with the congregation. That has been the work of this task force and we are excited to share with you this month. You will hear the invitation through sermons and several invitations about 'Following Jesus Passionately.' We invite you all to take this invitation seriously!

"Discipleship is an organic, life-long process. It has something to do with what Wesley called "sanctification". The process of becoming more and more holy, simply becoming more like Jesus, being 'set apart'. Basically, someone says it means you're different than you were. And that process continues until you die." (Cary Nieuwhof, pastor and writer in church leadership)

MMDC is a disaster relief facility located on an 8 acre campus, 4 miles south of Springfield, Illinois. Construction began in October of 1999 and opened for ministry in the year 2000. MMDC is a caring ministry related to the Illinois Great Rivers Conference and the North Central Jurisdiction of the United Methodist Church. MMDC is also a cooperating depot in the UMCOR (United Methodist Committee on Relief) Relief Supply Network as of January 2010.

MMDC's campus provides opportunities for individuals and groups of all walks of life, denominational backgrounds, abilities, and ages to help provide disaster relief kits and resources as well as educational and medical supplies to those in need both locally and internationally. MMDC provides that "hands on" mission experience.

Midwest Mission Distribution Center's history includes the construction of school desks; this has been an MMDC project since nearly the beginning. School desk projects are truly important to us, many people, hours and trials have gone into the work of fine tuning these designs and revisions.


New Book for Friendship's Library!

A big thank you to Julie Verson for donating a new book to the Friendship Library (in the Chapel).


