Reflections from Pastor Anna Shin

"Do not be confirmed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect." (Romans 12:2, NRSV)

Should churches join in the political talk or not? I wonder whether our congregation has thought about it. While political leadership of our nation has shown a peaceful transfer in January, over the past several weeks our nation has experienced a turmoil. Millions of women marched to make their voices heard. In every main city in our nation people have come out to the streets to protest whatever was decided. It is vivid that there are deep divisions among our citizens.

I believe we should. I don't need to bring up Karl Barth, 20th century theologian who says we need to have the Bible in one hand and the newspaper in the other hand. It's on everyone's mind, isn't it? The Bible itself deals with a full load of political struggles. Read the prophets, Kings, even Psalms. How about the Gospels and Paul's letters to the early churches? Just think about the statement of early Christians: Jesus is Lord. Or Jesus' own words: You can't have two masters. The Bible is deeply political.

"Religion and politics have always been deeply intertwined," someone blogged. It's true. The church has always been involved in political battle ground. Think about the Civil Rights Movement, the fight against Apartheid and the following Truth and Reconciliation Commission in South Africa, the liberation theology in Latin America, the ecumenical movement for an Interfaith dialogue or the Creation Care ministries-Justice for our Neighbor. Churches need to engage in the political talks. But how?

How do we talk politics without further pain or divisiveness but toward the wellbeing of the world and people in it, building up the beloved community that we all want to be in? Here are some suggestions that I found helpful in our denomination's resources to get started. Start with ground rules that insure mutual respect:

- Don't assume they voted for their candidate for the exact reason you didn't. In other words, don't assume the worst in them and the best in yourself.
- Plan to listen deeply for the personal stories behind the political passion.
- Assume they're not all wrong and you're not all right.
- Assume God loves you all.
 (by Rebekah Simon-Peter, 'Should Churches Discuss Politics?', Ministry Matters.com)

Once these are in place, we should look for the biblical principles and ask how they get played out in a particular policy or issue: Do they build us up as a community or tear us down? This might be a great start as a congregation. If we engage in the conversations in such a way, deeply grounded in the knowledge of God and speaking the truth in love, I am certain, we are living out what the apostle Paul says in his letter to the Romans.

With that, please make every effort to join Sacred Conversations with Karen Young, intercultural trainer, on February 19, March 19, and April 30 from 11:30-1:00. This will be a great place to learn how to have difficult conversations. May God's mercy be upon us as we hold one another accountable

as faithful followers of Jesus Christ as we seek to discern how to live here and now.

The children will continue with the Deep Blue Curriculum and learn about the life of Jesus!






