

## **Reflections from Pastor Anna Shin**

"I lift up my eyes to the mountains; where is my help to come from?"

I have learned that prayers come in different forms. Sometimes they are short breath prayers, like saying a short word or phrase: 'Be still and know God,' or 'Your love is enough,' or 'Your Presence, Your Peace" while breathing in and out. Other times they are long conversations with God. Prayer somehow changes us. It moves us beyond ourselves, not out of the world, but in to the world. It opens us for new ways to realize a well in the desert.

I recently learned an expression, *solvitur ambulando*. It's Latin and means, "It is solved by walking around." What do you do when you have faced a problem, couldn't make up your mind over some issues? Take the mind off from your stuff. Go for a walk. Ride a bike. Find company in silence. *Solvitur ambulando*. It may be solved in walking.

So often when I am stewing about something the answer is not to be found by thinking harder and harder. It may sound counterintuitive but rather when I've stopped looking for it, not thinking about it, taking the mind off completely, and do something different like taking a walk for a while or working out at the gym, or pulling weeds in my much-neglected back yard (and front yard), or washing dishes, by getting my body moving around, an insight or idea or entirely different way of facing things emerge or "revealed."

The Psalmist sings, "I lift up my eyes to the mountains", not focusing on my problem but taking the mind off of it and then the help may come to me from God.

Summer is a good time to take a walk or a long hike. The Christian spiritual practice names it 'prayer walk.' I'll be delighted to hear from you how many steps you walk during summer.

### Northern Illinois Annual Conference June 4-6, 2017

This was my first experience with attending the Annual Conference with hundreds of United Methodist Pastors and laity from all over Northern Illinois. The Theme of this year's conference was "Light Shines Through..."

There were 3 beautiful worship services, I each day, each led by Bishop Sally Dyke with music by Marcia Mc Fee. Pastor Anna uses some of Marcia McFee's worships themes. Day I was an ordination service for new pastors and deacons. Day 2, was a retirement service. Pastor Jamie Hanna Williams, our former pastor, and her husband were part of this group. On day 3, a memorial service was held to remember those that have passed on.

We heard many reports from committees and commissions of the AC – much is being done throughout Northern Illinois. One of the important items on the agenda was the restructuring of the Annual Conference and district leadership. As a result of 9 months of study, they hope to be able to provide more help for local churches, such as Friendship.

Friendship collected 31 hand towels and 54 washcloths for the Midwest Mission Distribution Center. We also donated \$675 to the Bishop's Appeal for the United Methodist Global Aids Fund. The goal for the entire Northern Illinois Conference was \$50,000, however, the total collected was \$71,400!! There are 6 districts in the NIC, and we are part of the Aurora district. The Aurora district collected the most! Thank you for your contributions to both.
