Reflections from Pastor Anna



I planted, Apollos watered, but God gave the growth.
(1 Corinthians 3:5)

I long to see you...that we may be mutually encouraged by each other's faith.

(Romans 1:11)

God is able to provide you with every blessing in abundance, so that ...you may share abundantly.

Let us make a joyful noise to him with songs of praise! (Psalm 95:2)

These are some examples from the Bible that have kept me on the path. The Bible has a mysterious power. In whatever the circumstances I find myself, when I open myself to it, it offers something for me. It speaks to me. Sometimes it invites me to step back and take a deep breath. It leads me to see beyond my near-sightedness. Other times it strikes me right there absorbing my whole breath. It gives me strength to stand up even when there would be no soul who stands alongside. I wonder what your experience has been with the Bible.

As a pastor I am often confronted with questions that people have kept deep in their heart. Mostly those questions come out of painful experiences, struggles, and witnesses in real life: during the difficult times in life such as illness, conflict in relationships, loss of opportunity for a better life, or witnessing to unimaginable

atrocities in our world, unmanageable natural disaster, or the unbelievable damage and abuse that destroy the life of young people.

The more absurd thing is that scripture is often quoted to force the vulnerable to keep silent. And it is often used to keep the peace (I should say 'status quo.') in the community at the cost of the lives of the victims, instead of speaking the truth for a better world. (I was listening to the news about the former House Speaker, Dennis Hastert's sentencing.)

I believe the 'Bible is a guidebook for life' is not enough. John Wesley, the founder of the Methodist Movement, offers a tool for us as we reflect on our faith in life. He believed that the living core of the Christian faith was revealed in 'scripture' and therefore it is the primary source for the reflection of living faith. However, we need to consider having reason, tradition, and experience to have a healthy and living faith. So we call it, 'Wesleyan Quadrilateral.' In other words, the good faith would be vivified in personal experience, and needs to be reflected through human rationality and tradition of accumulated wisdom of the church.

I wonder what the Bible speaks for you, if it does, in today's world. Come to worship with us weekly as we explore the truth through the Bible, tradition, reason, and our experience (questions) in life.


- In 2014 United Methodists gave more than \$135 Million to support various ministries such as education, advocacy and outreach.

First Quarter Stewardship Report

The Stewardship Committee thanks you for your generous support of Friendship Church in the first quarter. 2016 pledges showed a significant increase of \$20,000 over 2015 with a total of \$246,563. Through March our members have given \$56,308 or 91.40%. The Church Council approved the 2016 budget based on receiving \$230,000 from pledge income. If our giving for the first quarter continues at the same pace for the rest of the year it will total \$230,482. If we are able to continue this level of giving, we will end the year with 99% of our budgeted income.
