Reflections from Pastor Anna

"In all this I have given you an example that by such work we must support the weak, remembering the words of the Lord Jesus, for he himself said, "It is more blessed to give than to receive." (Acts 20:35)

As I have prepared for our fall campaign, Extravagant Generosity: the Heart of Giving, I have realized that we do not celebrate enough how much we love one another, encourage one another, and care about the well being of our friends in faith. As I pause and reflect on the last several years of our ministry, I have ascertained that God is at work in our lives and Friendship Church in ways we sometimes cannot see or understand well.

The Scope of Ministries that I am sure you all have received and read has been one of the fruits of this fall campaign. It shows us how faithfully and diligently Friendship United Methodist has been serving God and God's people wholeheartedly. It is clear that we have a clear understanding that we have been called to be the voice, hands and feet of Christ in our community and beyond.

Maybe you cannot go on a mission trip or serve at Day Break Shelter, or teach Sunday School for young people, or sing in the choir or play the guitar or drum, or be as directly involved as you would like, but there is a way you can greatly affect every single ministry we have. Through your generosity, you are a stakeholder in God's work, allowing others to go when you cannot.

Our scope of ministry plans for next year are entirely dependent on God's grace and provision through you. How do you see God at work in our lives and church? How will God lead you to be a significant part of real hands-on ministry through your generosity?

Please join me in preparing your heart in prayer, focusing on this game-changing question: "If everyone in my church gave like me, would my church be alive with exciting, impactful, life changing ministries, or only mediocre and insignificant?"

Many of you have been praying with the daily devotional of Bishop Schnase, *Practicing Extravagant Generosity*. In the Tuesday reading for Week One, he challenges us to dream big. He writes, "the buildings, programs, ministries, job descriptions, and services we build—are they for our own comfort and coziness? Or are they to further the faith and provide for future generations? Does our giving serve us and our needs or serve God by serving the mission of the church to reach new people?"

I would like our Friendship Church to have this question in mind as we envision our future together. I believe there is no limit to what God can accomplish in our lives and in our church, if you and I let go of our own schemes and trust God.

Crop Hunger Walk Update




Church Council meetings are open to all. We generally meet in February, April, June, August, and October-November.
