

Reflections from Pastor Anna Shin

"Let us hold fast to the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who has promised is faithful. And let us consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, ..." (Hebrews 10:24-25, NRSV)

The writer of Hebrews encourages the followers of Christ to provoke one another to love and good deeds. I somehow understood the word 'provoke' as something negative as a way of defense or "an attempted excuse for violence", saying, "He provoked me!"

But the early Christians knew to be faithful what we need is to be in community where good people of faith provoke one another to love, encourage with their words, thoughts, and actions. Otherwise our world can be quickly filled with provoking the worst out of us.

The word of Pope Francis delivered at one of the TED talks has reminded me of my call to be a Christian leader: "To Christians, the future does have a name, and its name is Hope." I have realized more and more that giving hope, showing hope, holding fast to hope so that becoming hope in life together should be my main theme for life.

This month we begin a stewardship focus on *Experiencing Joy in Generosity*. We will offer a daily devotional for three weeks, starting October 30 through November 17. I believe most of you have experienced the real joy in life can be found in generosity, and generosity begins when we become aware that all that we have are not our own earnings but are given as gifts from God.

Have you ever wondered why you are left with such a joyful feeling when you are able to give a gift to your church or to help a person in need? The answer to that question may be rooted in us as Christians who are being created in the image of God. To be made in God's image means we are made to be like our Creator whose nature is to give.

Giving helps us feel fulfilled as we reflect God's nature. Although the image of God was broken and wounded by sin, as those converted by faith in Jesus, we "have put on the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge after the image of its creator" (Colossians 3:10). Our Creator empowers us to restore whom we are created to be. And with this attitude of joyful giving, others find hope through us as we become witnesses and instruments of God's faithful love.

Like David, we exclaim, "But who [are we]...that we should be able thus to offer willingly? For all things come from you, and of your own have we given you" (1 Chronicles 29:14).

Come and join us in worship. I hope our message and sharing faith from your friends in faith will be a blessing to you and your family!

Women in Mission become United!

On October 20, a group of twenty- five women of Friendship Church came together to hear the life stories of four of our sisters in faith. Their journeys to Christ brought them from four different countries to America and each woman had a moving and inspirational story to tell. From Nigeria, India, the Philippine Islands and Sierra Leone, each one of these dedicated women showed strength and perseverance through their love of Christ and a desire to lead a better life for themselves and their children. Yetunde Olatunde told of her large United Methodist congregation in Nigeria whose women unite in groups called "societies" which raise funds for the betterment of their church and community. Yetunde's group formed a health clinic which serves not only her congregation but her community. A fourth generation United Methodist Indian woman, Irene Christian shared her story of her relatives who became Methodists after missionaries came to India to preach the love of Jesus. So influential was the faith of her forefathers, that today Irene is studying to become a local United Methodist pastor. Our third story came from Mila Valdez who shared her story of being raised Catholic and finding both the love of Jesus and the love of her husband Boyet as they worked together side by side to raise awareness of the plight of tenant farmers in their homeland. Becoming United Methodists, they emigrated to the US and found their home in Bolingbrook and at Friendship Church. Finally, we heard the story from Mariatu Nettey who was raised a Muslim yet learned the love of Jesus Christ by "following her neighbors to church." During civil war in her homeland of Sierra Leone, Mariatu had to leave all that was familiar, including her father and mother and flee to America with her small child. Only her faith that God had a plan for her kept her going forward toward the life she leads today. We are so grateful for these strong women who shared their life stories as witnesses of what the love of Jesus can do!

At our meeting, our group discussed the mission and focus of United Methodist Women of the United Methodist Church. After careful consideration, it was unanimously decided that our Friendship Women in Mission would became a chapter of United Methodist Women. With the focus on women's issues and supporting youth, we are looking forward to working together in mission to achieve these goals. We invite all women of Friendship Church to join us!

Stewardship and Financial Update

The Stewardship team is pleased to report that our members have shown strong support for the ministries of Friendship Church. The Church Council approved a budget that projected a total of \$242,000 in giving from our members. Through September 30th, our members have given a total of \$183,715 which is 76% of our annual goal. There is normally a drop off in giving in the summer but this year there was very little change. We are so grateful for your conscientious and faithful support of Friendship Church.

Our Financial Secretary, Carol Fetters, recently sent out financial statements. If you turned in a pledge card last year, the statement shows your progress towards your annual pledge. To be "on target" you should be at 75% of the annual total. If you have fallen behind and can catch up by the end of the year, it will help us fully support our ministries. If you did not turn in a pledge card the report shows how much you have given to date. Please give prayerful consideration to what God is calling you to do to show your appreciation for the many blessings in your life.

The annual Stewardship campaign will kick off on October 29th with the theme, "Experiencing Joy in Generosity." You will hear testimonials in the worship services and you will receive daily devotional emails that will guide you in your decision of how you will support Friendship Church in 2018 with your prayers, your presence, your gifts, your service and your witness. On Sunday, November 19th we will have our annual Thanksgiving dinner celebration.
