

Throughout the history of the biblical people, Moses' life and faith have been in the deep center and the background of Christian faith.



Reflections from Pastor Anna Shin

"Be still, and know that I am God!" (Psalm 46:10)

"Therefore, the LORD God, the holy one of Israel, says: In return and rest you will be saved; quietness and trust will be your strength—but you refused." (Isaiah 30:15)

As the summer comes to an end and a new school year begins, I have seen several signs of 'garage sale' in my neighborhood. I should have done it, I thought. If I have done it regularly or at least each time when kids move out, my life could have been much tidy and less chaotic, I thought. It doesn't need to be 'garage sale' since it requires a bit of organizational skills. What I need is a house cleaning, not just tidying up but getting rid of accumulated stuff, I thought.

But deep down in my soul, I know what I need. I need quietness that I would get in touch with the love of God that has dwelled within my soul. And during the morning devotion this week I discovered the presence of God in my life again in the words of prophet Isaiah: "Therefore, the LORD God, the holy one of Israel, says: In return and rest you will be saved; quietness and trust will be your strength—but you refused." (Isaiah 30:15) I know I need to surrender to the pull of Christ who dwells within.

It has been brutally challenging month to be Jesus followers. How in today's world, in this 'great nation', can such an unimaginable ugly violent hatred action and words of white supremacy be in public arena without restraint? We must ask what the ordinary like us can do about it? What should Christians, the followers of Jesus teaching, do about it? Isn't it Jesus reminded the religious leaders at his time that "if they (the disciples of Jesus) were silent, the stones would shout" (Luke 19:40)?

The Apostle Paul pleads, "Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good." (Romans 12:21, NRSV). Archbishop Desmond Tutu in South Africa reminds the desolate with this word, "Love is stronger than hate; Goodness is stronger than evil" which is included in one of our worship song books. I want Friendship struggle with a question: What does 'love' and 'overcome evil with good' speak to you today?

My friends, how have you been preparing yourself for a new season, a season of maturing toward harvest? Coming together for worship and sharing your experiences with others who might have had different experiences may open a new way to be touched with the presence of God in this difficult time to live like followers of Jesus.


Calling All Fifth, Sixth and Seventh Graders!
