






Q2. What is your age?


Q5. What, if anything, has been the MOST UNSATISFACTORY or CHALLENGING thing about our Zoom worship services?

Not meeting with people face to face.		


Q6. After this time of social-distancing and online worship, what do you think will be the change to your pattern of worship?


Changes in Worship Patterns




Q7. Given your current understanding of the spread of coronavirus, which of the following is necessary for you to attend an in-person worship service?




Q8. Given your current understanding, when do you predict you might feel comfortable attending inperson worship?




Q9. If worship services were offered in mid-August, how comfortable do you think you will feel attending?




Q10. When we resume in-person worship services, how important will the following measures be for you to have a sufficient comfort level? (Top 8 Most Important)




Q10. When we resume in-person worship services, how important will the following measures be for you to have a sufficient comfort level? (Next 8 Most Important)




