What are the Stations of the Cross?

The Stations of the Cross depict through artistic expression the path that Christ walked on the day of his crucifixion. This walk, a journey through passion and prayer, also known as the Way of the Cross, functions as devotion during the Lenten season for centuries.

Walking the Stations of the Cross Sharing Space with Christ

On Ash Wednesday of 2020, February 26th, the first non-travel case of COVID was confirmed in the United States. As Lent continued, our world began to shift and soon it shuttered.

Living in spheres surrounded by chaos, we searched for our footing as we left our familiar home with no clear path to our new domicile. And so we found ourselves on the threshold, the past behind us and the future unknown, living in liminal space.

As we have experienced this collective liminal space during the past year, we have also experienced together unprecedented grief and suffering, witnessed a shifting democracy, and have been challenged to be accountable to systemic racism and respond to our neighbors now in poverty.

In the journey to the cross, Christ models for us how to embrace and breathe in the "place between."

As unsettling as this space is, the openness of liminal space allows us to be receptive and teachable. The fluidity of the "place in between" dares us to set aside our perceptions of normal and to create a new way.

During Lent 2021, you are beckoned to walk the Stations of the Cross, allowing Christ to share the sacred liminal space with you, and grace you with endurance and hope for the journey ahead as you step your foot off of the threshold onto a new path.

And so we have found ourselves on the threshold, the past behind us and the future unknown, living in liminal space.

Station 1: Jesus Prays Alone.

Luke 22:39-44

Jesus left and made his way to the Mount of Olives, as was his custom, and the disciples followed him. When he arrived, he said to them, "Pray that you won't give in to temptation." He withdrew from them about a stone's throw, knelt down, and prayed. He said,

Station 2: Jesus is Arrested.

Matthew 26:47-56

While Jesus was still speaking, Judas, one of the Twelve, came. With him was a large crowd carrying swords and clubs. They had been sent by the chief priests and elders of the people. His betrayer had given them a sign: "Arrest the man I kiss."

Just then he came to Jesus and said, "Hello, Rabbi." Then he kissed him.

But Jesus said to him, "Friend, do what you came to do."

Then they came and grabbed Jesus and arrested him.

One of those with Jesus reached for his sword. Striking the high priest's slave, he cut off his

ear.

Then Jesus said to him,

"Put the sword back into its place.

Station 4: Pilate tries Jesus.

John 18:33-37

Station 13: Jesus dies on the Cross.


John 19: 28-34

After this, knowing that everything was already completed, in order to fulfill the scripture, Jesus said, "I am thirsty."
A jar full of sour wine was nearby, so the soldiers soaked a sponge in it, placed it on a hyssop branch, and held it up to his lips.
When he had received the sour wine, Jesus said, "It is completed." Bowing his head, he gave up his life.
It was the Preparation Day and the Jewish leaders didn't want the

bodies to remain on the cross on the Sabbath, especially since that Sabbath was an important day. So they asked Pilate to have the legs of those crucified broken and the bodies taken down.

Therefore, the soldiers came and broke the legs of the two men who were crucified with Jesus.

When they came to Jesus, they saw that he was already dead so they didn't break his legs. However, one of the soldiers pierced his side with a spear, and immediately blood and water came out.
